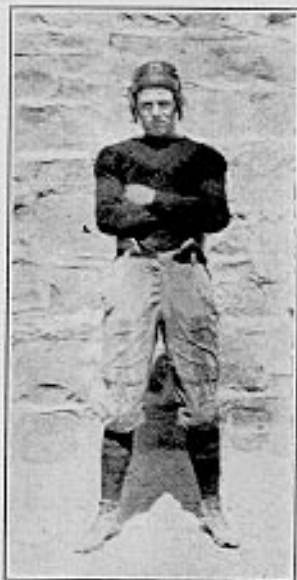

In the class series the honors were easily carried off by the College freshmen; the special vocational class taking second place.

Following these games Coach Fogt began a sorting and sifting process until new Orange jerseys with black T's were finally awarded to eight men. The men wearing the Orange and Black varsity equipment were Horsley, Captain; Fitzgerald, T, West and Frayar, forwards; Hill, Center; Hibner, Guard and Center; Stacy and Thorpe, Guards.

The game deciding the Southern Idaho Conference Championship was played with Gooding College in the new Tech Gymnasium on March 21, the Tech Tigers easily carrying off the honors.

School and Faculty Champs

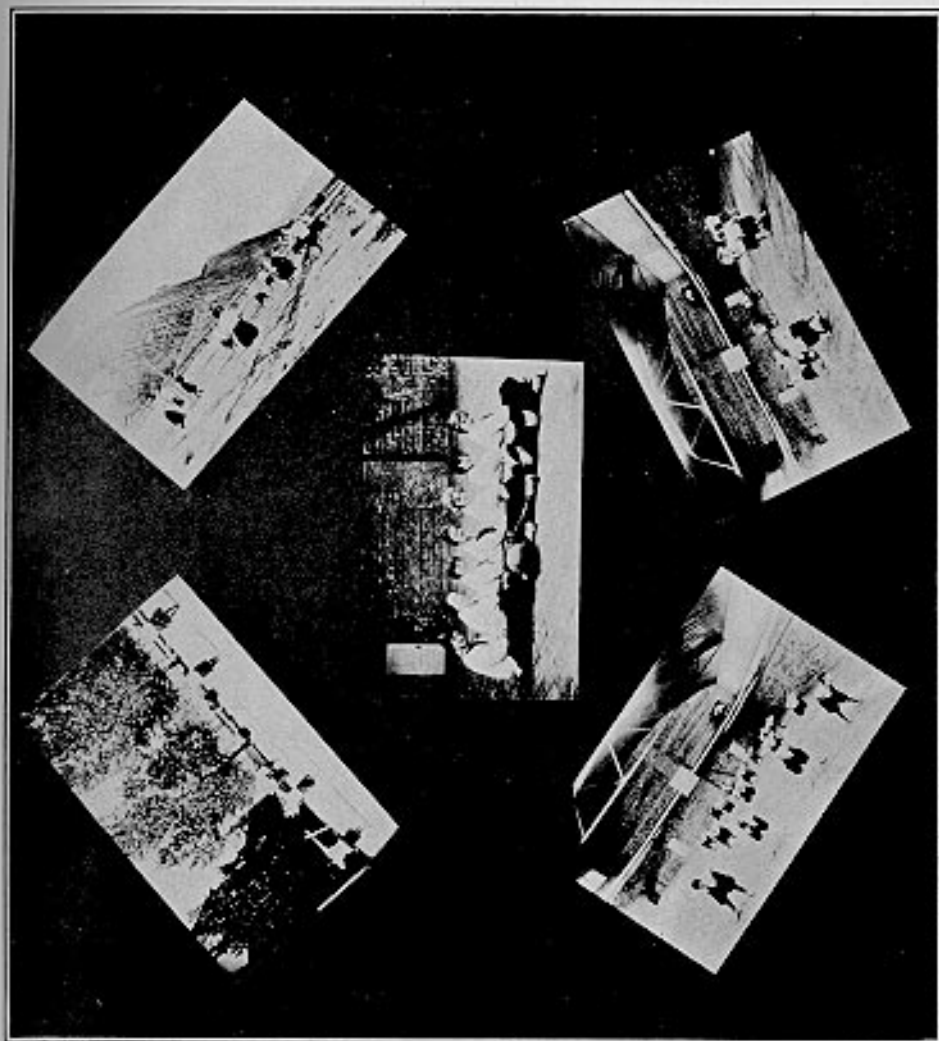
