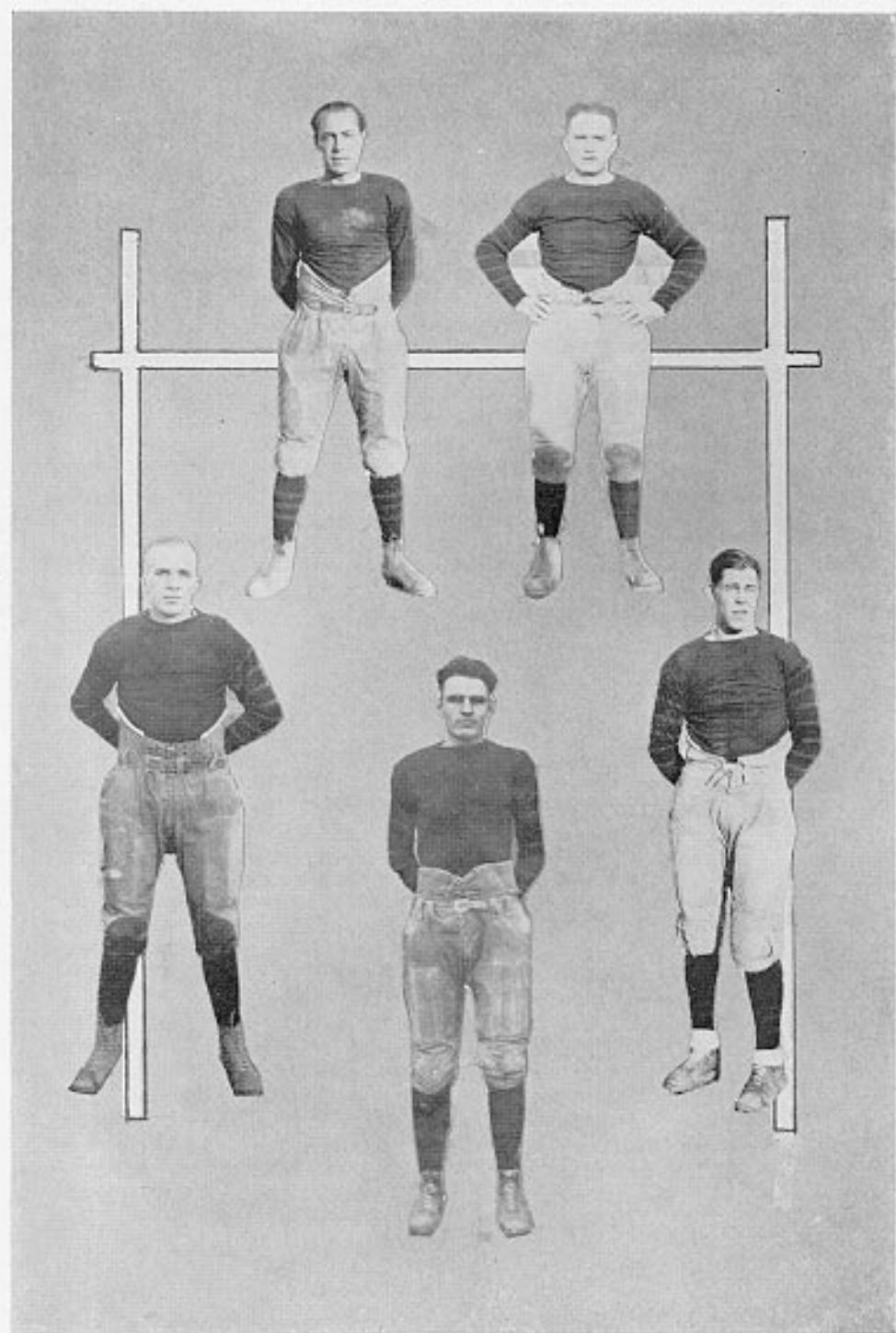


The Squad
