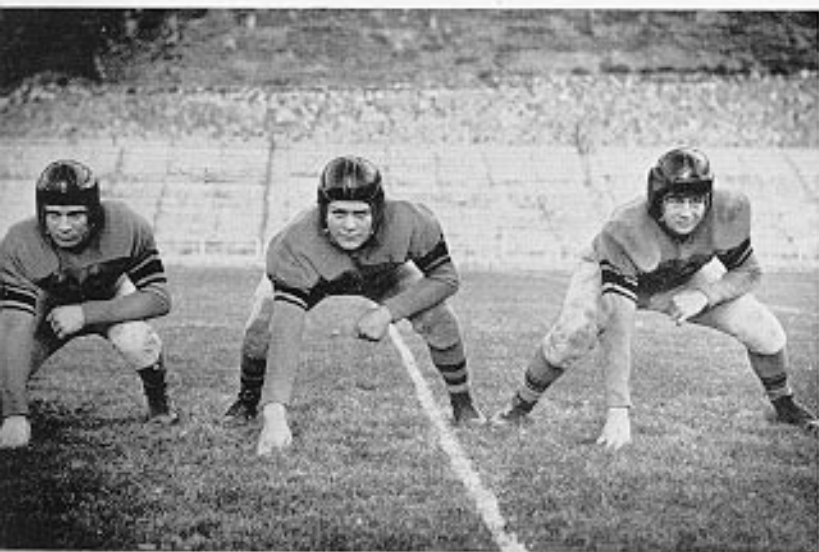
Riddled with injuries, the Tigers kept a rough-house appointment with the mighty University of Nevada Wolves who exhibited their predatory skill by mangling and outclassing Idaho team 62-0. Brushing aside a valiant little team, the Wolves scored nine touchdowns almost at will and Idaho's offense never carried farther than the Nevada 30-yard stripe. Victory was sweet when the Bengals trounced their traditional rivals, College of Idaho, 19-13, ignoring pre-game rumors that they were the underdogs of the fray. Dale Dykeman scored all Bengal touchdowns on goal line plunges as time after time the ball had been marched into

scoring territory by an inspired team. Trailing 24-26, George Atkinson, Tiger Tailback, flipped a pass in the air while the timer pulled the trigger of the final gun, giving Idaho Southern a sensational victory over Albion State Normal School, 31-26. The game was a thrill-packed, free-scoring melee in which the lead changed four times.

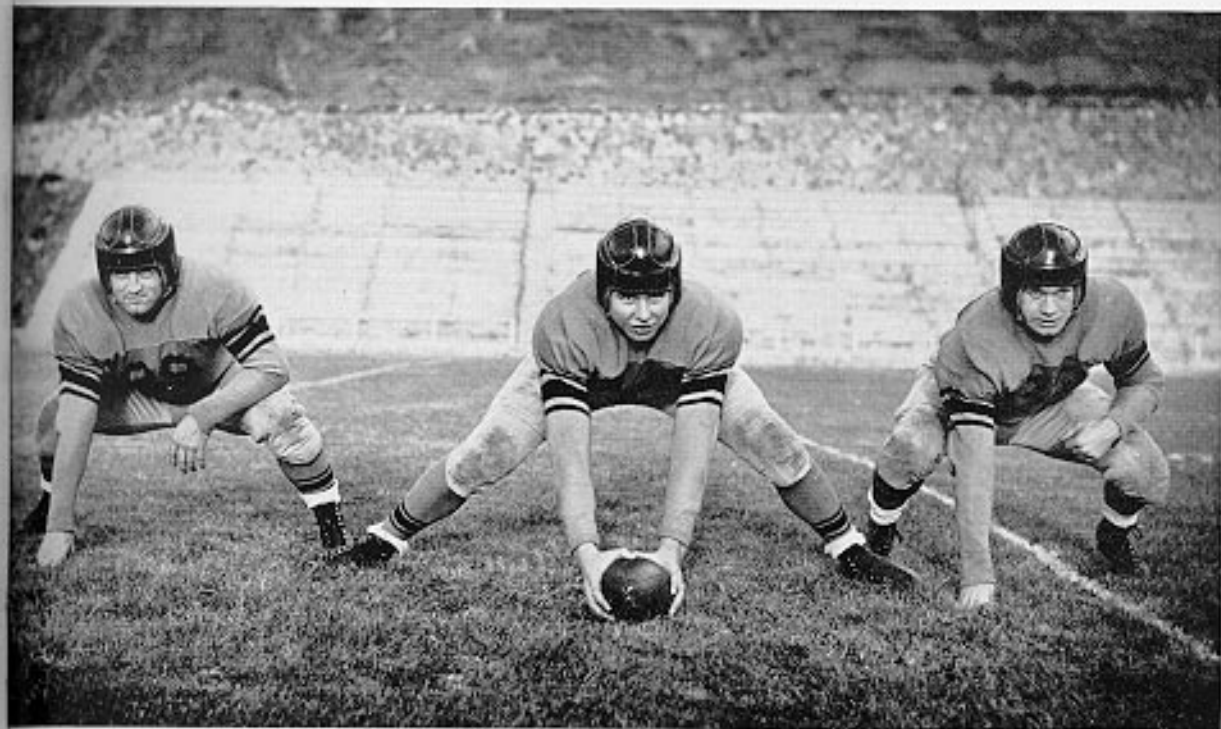

The invading Bobcats of Montana State University took a little of the sweet out of Idaho Southern's Homecoming celebration with a 15-7 win... while the Bengals won the game on paper. The Bobcats were outgained and outkicked, but capitalized on a blocked kick and goal line pass to take the contest. Montana State scored in the third play of the game on the old "Statue of Liberty" play from the mid-field stripe, failing in the conversion. The Bengals pushed aside the Bobcat line in a steady, 60-yard march to score in the third period. Pete Gallagher kicked the extra point to put Idaho in the lead, 7-6. The fourth quarter saw Montana State score on a safety and a goal line toss and the game ended 15-7.



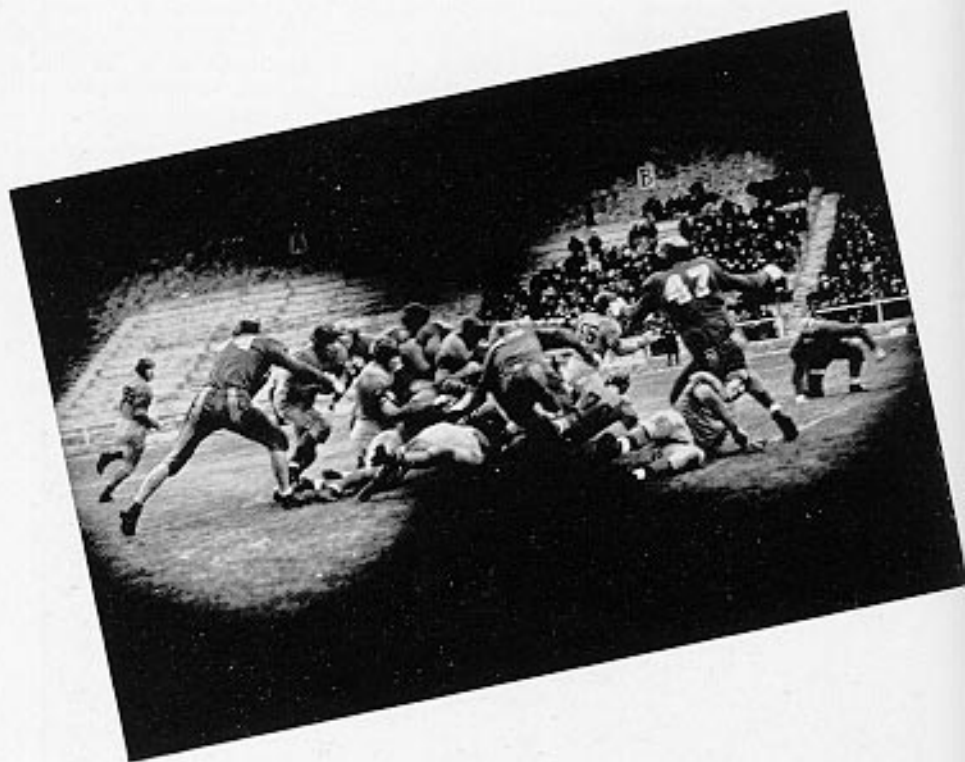

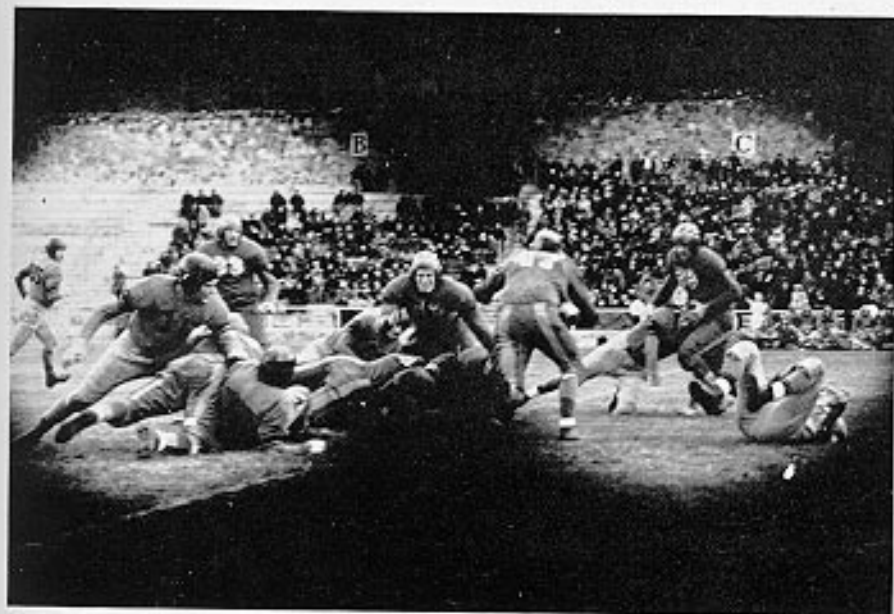

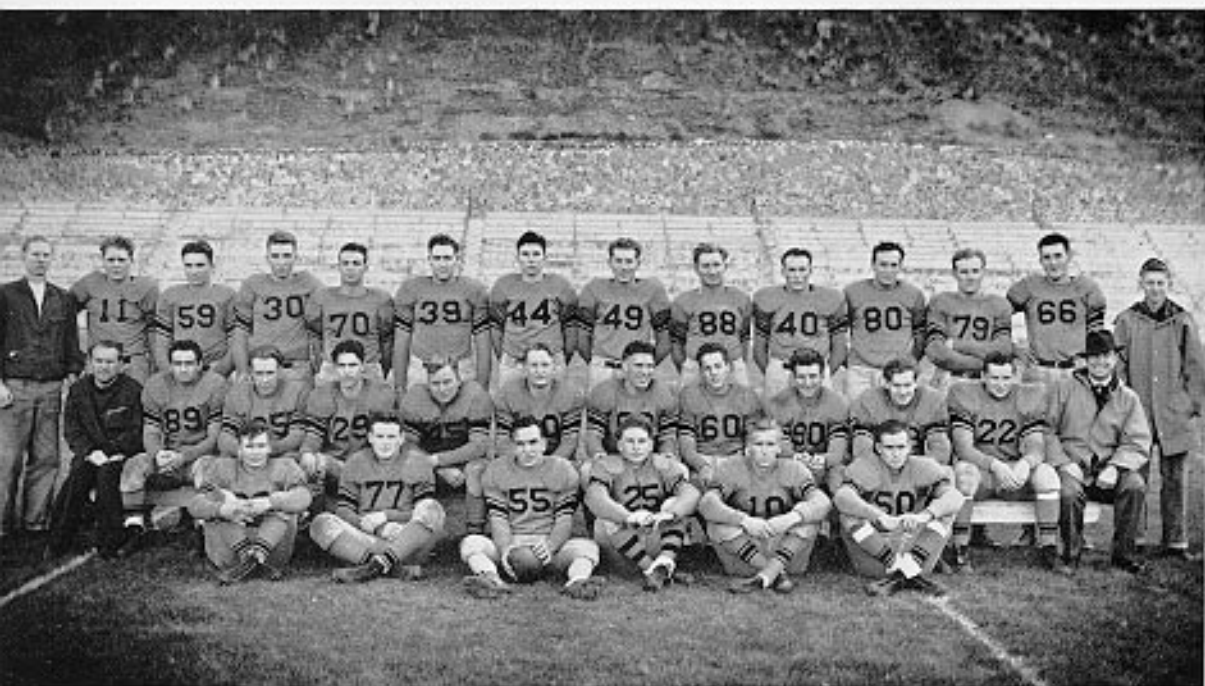

Ray Freeman, sensational negro fullback of the Weber College Vikings, led his teammates to a 27-19 victory over Idaho Southern before a shivering crowd of faithful fans in Ogden, Utah's municipal stadium. Weber took the ball on the opening kickoff and held it for a sustained drive down the length of the field to paydirt. Freeman again was instrumental in the three counters registered in the third period which sewed up the game for the Vikings. Idaho scored once in the first period and twice in the fourth period rally by a fighting Tiger eleven. Dale Dykeman, Pete Gallagher, and Jim Erley accounted for the Bengal touchdowns, with brilliant line work by Steuben Thomas, Ray Wells, and Ray Taylor. The last game of the season saw the Bengals traveling again to Southern California to engage Compton Junior College. Two touchdowns in the final quarter proved to be the margin of victory for the coast team as the contest ended 21-7. Idaho Southern's only touchdown came in the opening frame when Jed Owens, Bengal quarterback, crossed the goal from the Compton 10-yard stripe.
