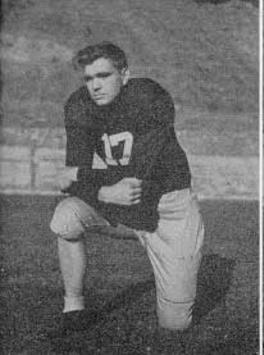

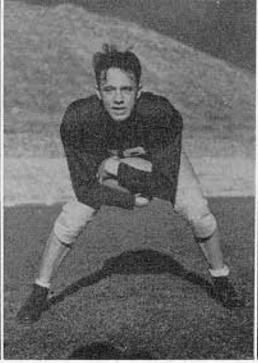

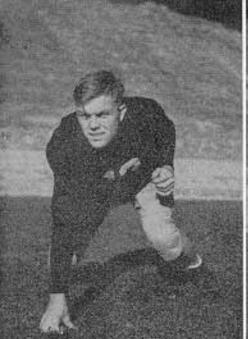
AND FOR THOSE WHO SURVIVED P.T.

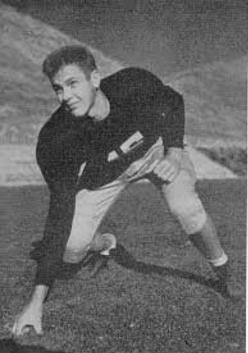

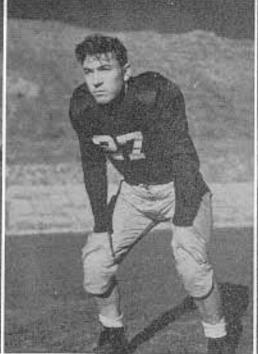

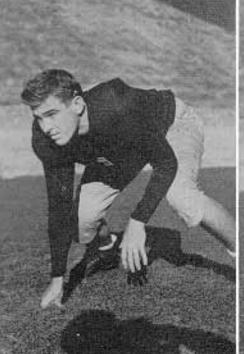
THERE IS FOOTBALL...

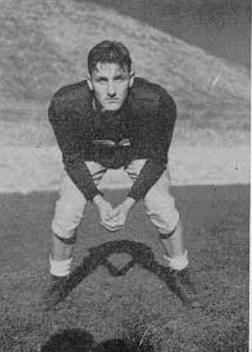
